


Outsourcing & offshoring are not the same thing

Why outsourcing*

 Better quality software and applications in the end 	41%
 Better control of the development process through SLA's 	38%
 More accountability for the projects 	37%
 Faster time to market for developments 	36%
 Better project planning 	33%
 Reduced cost of development 	31%
 Better communication with the end user department 	13%

Why outsourcing

- Go from fixed (high) costs to flexible (fit to needs) costs
- Compensate for peaks in need for personnel
- Need for specific knowledge and/or experience
- Independent judgment of quality




What changes in your organization when outsourcing / offshoring IT Development?




Changes when outsourcing

- A purchasing department remains
- Purchasing:
 - Selects the supplier
 - Makes a contract / SLA
 - Makes assessment of the supplier
 - Supports the business to assess the product
- The Business accepts/assesses, but on what basis?
- Acceptance requires IT knowledge; not structured but occasionally
- How to cope with this?






Test levels in the V-model






Possible Situation 1
